Reena Bhatt makes Buddha shine

How the IT expert came to Winnenden, how she developed her talent for art and what painting means to her

Reena Bhatt's oil paintings shine. Because the 39-year-old from Hötten uses strong colors, either blue with strong ones. Light effects of green and yellow, with pink contrasted. "They are the colors of India" says the artist with a smile. But it's not just the colors, it's also the motifs radiate something: calm and inner peace. The "A meditating Buddha brings beauty, comfort and bliss home," says Reena Bhatt. She did not notice when she started painting big canvases paint, and as the first picture the house grew.
